

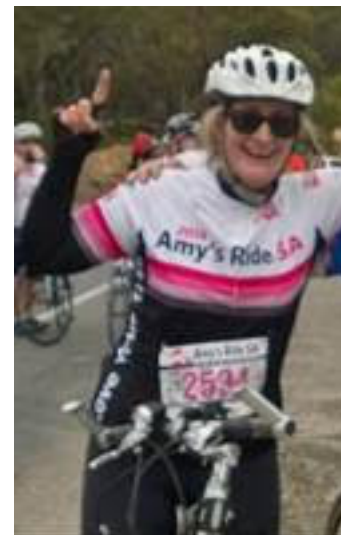


Speaker profile: Sara Fleming
